The wildflower projected at Gronant is scheduled to being soon in partnership with Flintshire County Council and North Wales Wildlife.

9. Numbering streetlights – Aluminium plates

10. Gwespyr Village Hall Donation

The Clerk shared an email received from Gwespyr Village Hall requesting a donation of £70.00 towards printing promotional flyers.

RESOLVED – All councillors agreed to the donation.

11. Summer play scheme 2026

Councillors were provided with the summer play scheme 2025 report. The play scheme in Penyffordd was very successful this year with the play scheme being extended from three weeks to six and a total of 745 children in attendance across that period. Llanasa Community Council is delighted with the outcome of this year's play scheme and have voted to have the play scheme again next year for a duration of six weeks.

RESOLVED - Clerk has contacted Flintshire to begin arrangements for next years play scheme.

A.O.B

1. Councillor Siobhan Cobb raised concerned about the potholes when entering the community centre in Trelogan. This issue has been reported multiple times since November 2024.

ONGOING – Clerk has contacted street scene, who have sent an officer to inspect and will advise with a plan of repairs.

2. Councillor Siobhan Cobb informed the council that the road from Penyffordd to Trelogan is coated in mud. This is dangerous to drivers.

RESOLVED – Clerk to contacted street scene, they have spoken with the farm and had the road cleaned up.

3. Councillor Ellen Harvey reported damage to the road in Talacre on Station Road.

ONGOING – Clerk has contacted street scene, an officer is being sent to investigate this further.

4. Clerk informed the council that the cost of installing the new notice boards in Ffynnongroyw, Penyffordd and Lobitos is £570.00.

RESOLVED – All councillors have approved this. Arfon has completed this work, three new notice board have been installed.
